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The thirteenth chapter of Romans—at least the first few words of verse one that say, "Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers" is a favorite section of Scripture appealed to by those who allege that Christians are obligated by God to render unquestioned obedience and submission to every law, ordinance, rule, regulation, edict, and decree promulgated by civil government.

But is this *really* what is being set forth in this chapter? Could God's Word contradict itself? If we are commanded *here* to blindly submit to all of the civil magistrate's laws, decrees, and temporal powers and surrender to him as our earthly sovereign the ultimate control of our actions, then were the exploits of the great heroes of faith throughout Scripture violations of God's

Word and orderly way? What of the Hebrew midwives, Rahab, Daniel, the three Hebrew children, the Apostles, and the early Christians who refused to obey civil authority? And what of the Pilgrims and the Puritans and other Christians who refused to bow to and obey King George? Are these, and others of their faith, spirit, and conviction to be considered disobedient rebels and used as examples of those with whom the Lord is displeased?

It is evident that the Scriptures mean far more concerning obedience to civil government than blind, mindless, spineless, unqualified obedience and submission that is being so carelessly promulgated today. The major emphasis of this book, however, is not disobedience to civil government rather, obedience to God, His Word, and His orderly way.

This crisis hour in America's history demands more than an academic reaction to or superficial concern with this subject of our responsibilities to obey God and civil authorities. Ignoring the issue will not diminish its impact on our lives. God's people must know and they can know how to live in obedience to His will, lordship, and orderly way in this real world, in all things according to the Scriptures.

One of the most severe judgments that God can pronounce on a people and a nation is His silence. And one of the certain indications that God has not passed by or abandoned a people and a nation is that the voice of

His true preachers has not been silenced or withdrawn.

God has neither passed America by nor abandoned her! Pastor John Weaver's ministry and this book are evidence of this blessed fact.

Pastor Weaver sounds the "certain sound of the trumpet" in the pages of this book by dealing with the heart of Romans 13 and by clearly showing just what the Christian's responsibility is regarding civil government. They know His voice and another they will not follow. Their allegiance is to Him. *All* of life is subject to His authority and lordship. His will is their supreme desire. They *must* obey God rather than men. Pastor Weaver shows that our obedience and submission to civil government must *always* be in keeping with the supreme sovereignty, authority, and will of God as

revealed in the Holy Scriptures.
